**Exaltation of the Cross:** The Feast of the Exaltation of the Cross recalls three historical events:

<u>Discovery of the True Cross (c. 326):</u>
According to tradition, St. Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, travelled to Jerusalem and discovered the cross.

<u>Dedication of the Church of the Holy</u> <u>Sepulchre (335):</u>

Constantine built a basilica over the sites of Calvary.

Recovery of the True Cross (628):

After the Persians captured Jerusalem and took the cross in 614, the Byzantine Emperor Heraclius defeated them and triumphantly returned the relic to Jerusalem.

Unlike Good Friday, which focuses on Christ's Passion, the Feast of the Exaltation celebrates the cross itself as a symbol of salvation and victory. The feast honours the transformation of a brutal instrument of execution into a "tree of life".
