After Secularisation: The Present and Future of British Catholicism. In this newly published book Our Lady's parish features in two chapters, New Forms of Parish Life: leadership and A Growing Confidence Reaching Out. The book shows that shows that Mass attendance has fallen steeply over the past decades; fewer people are receiving all the sacraments; fewer people believe. However, in certain distinct settings seem to offer signs of hope and renewal against an otherwise worrying backdrop of declining congregations, closing parishes, and cradle Catholics abandoning their religion in large numbers. The authors show that the Catholic Church is not dying out, there are signs of a British spring. The book is available from CTS.
