Advent Preaching Series: The Jubilee year of Hope comes to a close at the Epiphany. During Advent I will be preaching a homily series based on hope.

"Welcoming" is for the whole church community and not just those who greet people on the way in.

Many single people say that "church family" doesn't feel like it applies to Christmas – and this can feel extremely isolating. So let's not leave welcoming just to the 'welcome team'.

Consider how you could encourage the whole church to be outward looking in the lead up to Christmas.

Why go to Confession in Advent?

Advent brings to mind hope, love, joy and peace. But, December is also the darkest month of the year, and not just because of our distance from the sun. In Advent, we also cannot ignore that nagging feeling that all is not perfect in our lives. Bring that 'stump' that Fr Stephen was talking about at Mass last week to confession. Where you see a stump, God sees a start. Advent is a perfect time for reconciliation because of two reasons: One, it allows us to sacramentally acknowledge our own incompleteness.

Secondly, it allows God to touch us and create something new from our sins.

What advice is there to make a good confession this Advent? Go! Just do it! Any reason you can think of for not going is just the deceiver working against you. Tell the priest it has been a long time. Tell the priest you don't know the prayers. Tell the priest you are scared or that you can't remember everything you've done. And trust that he has heard lots worse than you will share. You can even Google "making a good confession" if that helps to make the first step about going.
